The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are a United Nations-sponsored effort to create a common set of goals to achieve by 2030. They have been adopted by all UN Member States at the end of 2015. The idea is to get governments, aid organizations, foundations and NGOs on the same page about what global problems most urgently need to be solved and how to measure progress and solutions. The CHERISH products are being defined according to those targets that are specifically aimed at improving the sustainable management of Non-Reproducible Goods.



Our aim

The aim of our project is to develop a didactic program dedicated to the VET system and aimed at improving the knowledge on the sustainable management of the Cultural Heritage and Natural Capital that can be considered, as a whole, as Non-Reproducible Goods (NRGs). Our goal is, thus, to provide the VET system with an integrated, interactive and multidisciplinary educational path, based on the state of the art of technical-scientific knowledge, best practices and policies developed by the main European institutions and enterprises.

The program will consist of didactic modules that will be developed as Open Educational Resources (OER) and will be characterized by a strong European perspective. They will be well focused on the EU implementation tools (e.g. ETIS indicators) and will be characterized by a cross-sectoral approach, aimed at offering an holistic overview on the different actions that contribute to the protection of the NRGs and to the promotion of sustainable tourism, with an eye on the conservation techniques of Cultural Heritage and Natural Capital.
