



Training modules



In July, all partner organisations finalised the translations for modules 0, 1, 2, 3 and 4 with slides for mentor training. The final translation of IO1 materials was also completed.

The diary of planned IO2 mentor training activities in September was approved and updated by all partner organisations.

Each project partner country was directed to contract mentors for career mentoring of young marginalised people.

Project progress

- The IO1 Career Mentoring Guidelines have been translated and are used by all partner organisations. SA tests are conducted with all mentors and trainers.
- Training materials for mentor training on IO2, the component modules of IO1, have now been finalized and included in the mentor training manual and e-mailed to all mentors.
- During the month of September, each project organization conducted a mentor training on the *IO1* and *IO2* training materials:

Bulgaria: 7 mentors - 14 mentees **Slovenia:** 7 mentors - 14 mentees **Lithuania:** 3 mentors - 6 mentees Cyprus: 6 mentors - 12 mentees **Iceland**: 10 mentors - 20 mentees **France:** 3 mentors 6 mentees

UK: 6 mentors - 12 mentees







The Association "To Preserve Women" hosted the third transnational TPM3 meeting in Varna, Bulgaria, where the project management was analyzed for the results of the implementation so far. Discussions were held on "Self-awareness" with workshops on target group profiles.

The overall aim of the third TPM meeting was for the partner organisations to discuss faceto-face their progress in applying the IO2 training materials and whether they were experiencing difficulties in using them:

Each partner organisation shared their views from the developed materials.

Divided into two groups for discussion and workshop the partners shared information on the application of the project activity in their practice.

The discussion on "Self-Awareness" led by Jackie addressed attitudes Mentors' attitudes about using the mentor training tools. The training evaluation form was discussed for feedback from the results.

In the discussion led by Virginie, the mentor profiles and mentees in the different partner organisations - a way of organizing the sessions, approaches in applying the training tools.
