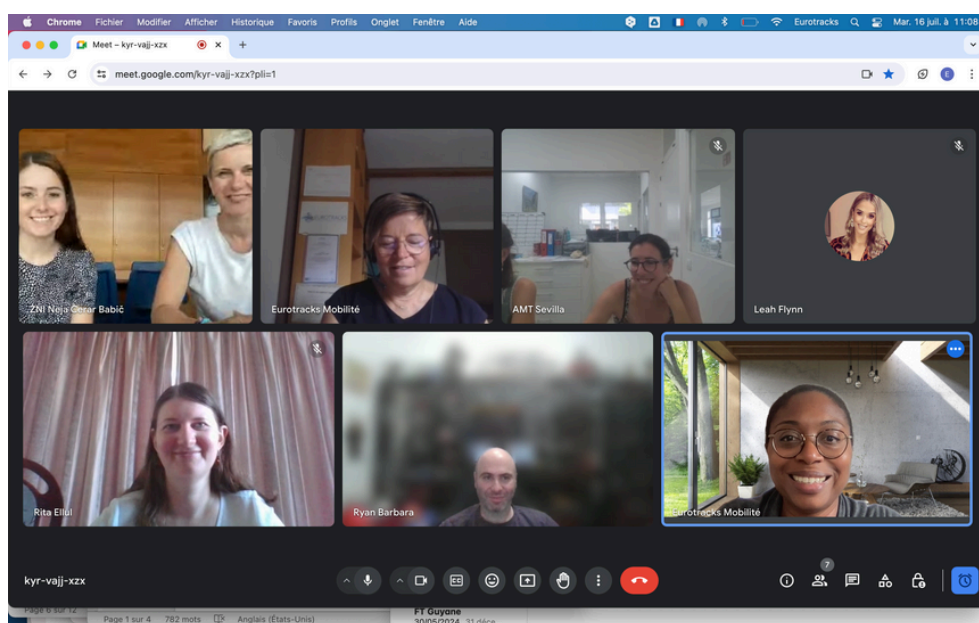




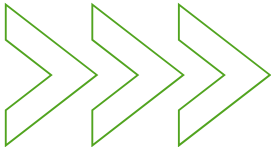
WHAT HAVE WE BEEN UP TO?

Behind the scenes, we have been diligently working on our eco-responsible project, focusing on sustainable practices and raising awareness among our stakeholders. We have been updating our social media accounts and taking note of the audiences we have been reaching to ensure maximum visibility of our SOFT project. We've also spent lots of time developing a charter and delivering this to some of our stakeholders. The first phase of this charter is given to stakeholders allowing them to assess and rank their current level of sustainability either in their home or work environment.

Each partner organisation, Eurotracks (France), Irish Education Partners (Ireland), AMT (Spain), Easy Job Bridge (Malta) and ZNI (Slovenia) have distributed this charter to their stakeholders in order to gather a wide variety of answers.



WHAT IS IN THE CHARTER?



We have created a sustainability charter for our stakeholders, which includes a series of questions designed to help them assess their current sustainability practices, either at home or in their work environments depending on who is answering. The charter encourages them to rank themselves on various aspects of sustainability, such as energy use, waste management, and resource consumption. By completing this self-assessment, stakeholders gain a clearer understanding of their environmental impact and are empowered to identify areas where they can improve.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?



Over the next few months, we plan to resend the sustainability charter to the same stakeholders with the aim of tracking their progress and seeing improvements in how they rank themselves. By revisiting the survey, we hope to encourage further reflection on their sustainability practices and provide an opportunity for them to reassess and make positive changes. In the meantime, we will continue to actively share content on our social media platforms, highlight our ongoing efforts, and offer practical tips on how individuals can improve their sustainability. This approach not only keeps sustainability top of mind but also fosters a sense of community and shared responsibility in driving meaningful environmental change during mobilities.
